Totem Sets Schedule for 2014

At the planning meeting on December 17, Totem officers and members set the schedule of activities for the coming year. Most activities will remain in their traditional date and time slots, although a few changes have been made. Also, several new cruises have been added – e.g., the Heavy Weather Cruise and Skits at Bremerton Yacht Club in February, the City Cruise to Bell Harbor in June and the Lighted Boat Viewing Cruise to Dock Street Marina in December. Also, several cruises have been scheduled for different dates – e.g., The Olympia Cruise is now in July to coincide with that city's Lakefair Days, and the Eagle Harbor Cruise has been moved ahead to September.

Bob Watson will be assuming the duties of Fleet Captain for 2014, as Tim Reding will be coordinating membership, and Patty Chastain will become Totem Line editor. Bob is looking for host teams consisting of an experienced member(s) as well as a newer member(s) for the cruises and will be approaching all members to get involved as a host – even those with "no boat." 

Victoria Customs Dock Relocated

Effective immediately, boaters clearing Canadian Customs at Victoria's inner harbour will do so at a new location. The Canadian Customs dock is now located on Raymur Point next to the Coast Victoria Harbourside Marina. The former customs dock located adjacent to the seaplane float on the downtown shoreline is no longer in use.

"The placement allows for a more efficient flow of marine traffic, allowing vessels to reach Customs facilities earlier in entrance to Victoria harbour," said Greater Victoria Harbour Authority President and CEO, Curtis Grad.



Caution Required in Local Waters

Orion Marine group will be installing piling at Pier 3 for the Port of Tacoma between the dates of December 10 and January 25. The project site is located in the outer Blair Waterway just north of the Husky terminal on the south west side of the shipping lane. Several barges will be moored via offshore anchors toward the center of

the waterway approximately 1000 feet in length and mooring lines extending to the pier. Typical working hours will be 0600 to 1800 hrs Monday to -Saturday. Vessels are requested to limit their speeds to reduce wake and to contact the derrick barge St. Helens on VHS channel 66 prior to entering the waterway to ensure safe passage and work conditions.

Orion Marine Group will also be conducting dredging operations at the Port of Olympia Marine Terminal and the Swantown Boatworks in Olympia Harbor. Dredging commenced about November 25 and will continue until approximately the first week of February. Operations will be conducted Monday through Saturday, 24 hours a day. The derrick barge Rainier and tug Skagit will monitor VHF channels 09, 13 and 16. Mariners are requested to use the slowest safe speed to minimize wakes when transiting the area.
